





PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Texas A&M University-San Antonio offers three programs of study; a Master's degree in Educational Administration, Principal certification, and Superintendency certification. The programs emphasize practical applications and competencies critical to principal and superintendent effectiveness in improving instruction, teacher quality and student achievement. It is the goal of the Educational Administration program at A&M-San Antonio to serve the needs of local school districts by developing highly skilled administrators. The Department of Educator and Leadership Preparation is committed to extending the knowledge base of educational leadership through a combination of scholarly inquiry, reflective practices and student-centered learning.

PROGRAM DETAILS

- The total number of credit hours required for a master's degree is 33 and includes State of Texas training for Texas Teacher Evaluation and Support System (T-TESS) supervisory certification.
- Principal (24 credit hours) and Superintendent (15 credit hours) certification programs can be completed in one year.
- Coursework is offered in convenient online classes.
- The University believes that this affords students the greatest amount of freedom and flexibility while also emphasizing student support resulting in highly-skilled graduates.

WHO SHOULD APPLY?

The program is designed for students interested in educational leadership whose career goals include teacher leadership, principalship, central office leadership, or superintendency.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Each applicant to the graduate program in Educational Administration must complete the following:

- 1. Each applicant must submit their application and required documents by the appropriate semester deadline to GradCAS at gradcas.liaisoncas.org/apply
- 2. Students seeking admission to the program must meet the basic requirements outlined in the Admissions section of the catalog. Students must have a valid Texas teaching certificate for entrance into the program. Applicants without an appropriate background may be required to complete additional preparatory coursework. at gradcas.liaisoncas.org/appl.

- 4. Candidates will submit a letter of recommendation from a current or former school leader, peer, A&M-San Antonio Education Leadership Program alumni, or current student in the Educational Leadership Program. In addition to an interview with the Graduate Advisor, candidates will submit a writing sample to be evaluated by the program faculty.

PROGRAM PREREQUISITES

In order to receive unconditional admission to the program, students must meet University admission requirements. Recommendations from campus and/or district supervisors will be considered for conditional admission. Students in this program must have a valid Texas teaching certificate for entrance into the program. Applicants without an appropriate background may be required to submit additional materials or complete additional preparatory coursework.

TEXAS PRINCIPAL CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS

Candidates seeking only Principal Certification must earn a minimum of 24 semester credit hours as follows:

- Possess a valid teaching certification in the State of Texas (TAC §241.15);
- Document two years of classroom teaching experience in an accredited school;
- Hold a master's degree from an accredited institution of higher education;
- Successfully complete a State Board for Educator Certification-approved principalship preparation program and be recommended for certification by that program; and
- Pass the principal certification exams (TExES 268 and PASL exams).
